Beethoven: Piano Concerto No 4 Beethoven's lyrical Fourth Piano Concerto begins with soloist rather than orchestra, foreshadowing the work's soft-spoken mood Most striking is the second movement, in which harsh strings are calmed by the gentle piano Strauss: Ein Heldenleben (A Hero's Life)
