Because quantitative assessments use numbers to describe the entity being tested, they tend to be more reliable than qualitative measures Reliability is the degree of stability exhibited when a measurement is repeated under identical conditions Inter-examiner reliability, thus, refers to the agreement between clinicians performing identical
